

The school has a School Development Plan (SDP) with the prioritised projects for developing the school. Names of the people who are responsible to co- ordinate projects are listed in the SDP. Parents on the SGBs are expected to play a leading role in many projects. Reports show that most successful projects are led by educators.



This case demonstrates that the educators are stakeholders with the most direct expertise and knowledge to implement projects. The SGBs should encourage teamwork between educators, parents and the community.

- Support the school's interests first
- Try to be impartial and fair in all proceedings.
